Today's trivia – What French made ski binding with named after a magazine read by WWII American GIs?

In 1948 the French sporting goods manufacturer Jean Beyl introduced a new binding meant to prevent spiral fractures of the tibia. Beyl wanted to give his new ski binding an American-sounding name. He noticed that American soldiers got weekly magazines with punchy names like Time, Life and Look. He chose Look as the corporate name, after the large-format photo magazine.
